Reserve Your Place Deposit / Tuition Refund Policy

A non-refundable **and** non-transferable deposit of \$250 *per child* reserves a place in the class. No tuition refunds are granted after the third session of classes.

Family Ambassador Referral Incentive Program

BJEP relies on word-of-mouth and our current families are our best source of referrals. You will receive \$250 refund of your tuition for EACH new student you refer who registers for BJEP for the full year, and attends at least the first three sessions.

Payment Options/Our Commitment to you**

- **Check:** Please make check payable to ‘BJEP’ and mail to: BJEP, PO Box 541014, Waltham, MA 02454
- **Credit Card:** Pay by [credit card](#) via PayPal. A \$50 per student convenience fee will be added to tuition. (Yes it’s the page that says Donate to BJEP).
- **Smart Tuition (also called, Blackbaud Tuition Management):** Pay monthly installments via Smart Tuition to spread out from June – Dec 2020. Smart Tuition charges a 2.85% fee for credit card or debit card payments, which is set-up directly with them. There is no fee for payments made through direct bank withdrawals. Smart Tuition also charges a \$50 per family yearly enrollment fee.
